

1,167 private schools: Borkotoky

Assam has currently 1,167 private schools, excluding play schools, and 420 private junior colleges are in the state.

[Education](#) minister Sarat Borkotoky told the House on Tuesday that the government permits a private education institute to [start](#) operations if it has own land.

A private institute has to fulfill the norms under The Assam Non-Government Educational Institution (Regulation and Management) [Act](#) 2006 and Rule 2007. For elementary education, permission has to be obtained under RTE [Act](#) 2009," said the minister.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
