

14 days police remand for Paul



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A lower court in Guwahati on Saturday remanded Dr Rakesh [Paul](#) to 14 days police custody a day after the APSC chairman was arrested on corruption charges.

Amid heavy security, police produced [Paul](#) before the CJM court in the Guwahati in the afternoon and sought 14 days remand saying that many stunning revelations would surface during the interrogation. But the courtallowed the police to keep Dr [Paul](#) in 14 days custody.

[Paul](#) was arrested in Dibrugarh on Friday morning and was brought to Guwahati for marathon interrogation in connection with a number of corruption charges [against](#) him.

Many organizations and individuals have thronged the court premises [as](#) the APSC [boss](#) was brought. KMSS activists urged the court not to let him go on bail.

Many political [leaders](#) have demanded exemplary punishment for [Paul](#) for allowing APSC to mire in corruption.

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
