

2 dead as bus rams into picnickers



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DIPHU: Two people died and another is battling with life when a bus rammed into a [group](#) of picnickers in Karbi Anglong district on Monday.

The incident took place in the morning at Bheloghat where the pucknickers were walking in the spot. Suddenly, a speeding bus came and rammed into the [group](#) of people who came from a tea garden since the [driver](#) was believed to have lost control [over](#) the [vehicle](#).

[One](#) died on the spot while another succumbed to his injuries in the hospital. Another is struggling with life in the hospital.

Police came to the spot and arrested the accused [driver](#) along with his associate in this connection.

"The [driver](#), in fact, lacked experience which was why he had no control [over](#) the bus. Stern action should be taken against him," said an eyewitness.

Another picknicker said, "the main reason behind this [tragic](#) incident is rash driving by half experienced [driver](#). This could have been averted."

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
