

2 students stood in top 10 from BTAD

Two students stood 4th and 10th position from Baksa district among top [10](#) in the state from BTAD region in today's declared HSLC results.

Ashim Majumdar of St. John HS School, Barama of Baksa district spotted 4th position securing 583 marks along with letter marks in all subjects. Dibyajyoti Boro of Tamulpur HS School stood 10th position securing 577 marks having letter marks in all subjects.

The Baksa district has credited top results in BTAD four districts securing 57.51 percentage while Chirang has met worse result with secured of 29.85 percentage.
