

9,100 HIV positive cases



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[Assam](#) grapples with at least 9,100 [HIV](#) positive cases.

Minister Nilomoni Sendeka informed the [Assembly](#) on [Wednesday](#) that as on March 31, 2014 Kamrup Metro district, which mostly comprise the [Guwahati](#) city, tops the [list](#) with [3,570](#) affected persons. He said that [Guwahati](#) is followed by [Cachar](#) district with [1,866](#) victims.

According to him, Dibrugarh has 630 cases, [Nagaon](#) 418, [Golaghat](#) 304, [Karimganj](#) 272, [Sonitpur](#) 252, Bongaigaon 228, [Karbi](#) Anglong 207 and Jorhat 207. He further disclosed that Chirang district does not have a single case of [HIV](#) case so far.

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
