

AAMSU demands Prez rule



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The All Assam Minority Students' Union([AAMSU](#)) has demanded Presidents' Rule in Assam alleging the state government's [failure](#) to [deal](#) with the law and order situation.

In an exclusive interview with Assam Times, [AAMSU](#) president Abdur Rahim Ahmed said that the [Congress](#) government has been failing to ensure safety and security of the common people.

He said that Presidents' rule is only the option to ensure peace and normalcy in the state. "The rebels are running parallel government which is why the common people are forced to bear the brunt."

He did not spare the centre saying that both Delhi and Dispur are mired in [mud](#) slinging to gain political mileage instead of taking any concrete steps to ensure normalcy.

"I do urge both governments not to do politics on the recent [carnage](#) by the militants. They should help the state restore normalcy by ensuring peace and harmony among all sections of communities," he said.
