

AAMSU voices over NRC move

UDALGURI: The All Assam Minority Students' Union ([AAMSU](#)) staged a two-hour sit-in-demonstration in front of DC office in [Udalguri](#) on Thursday. The programme was held under the aegis [Udalguri](#) district committee of the [student](#) body strongly voiced against the purported suggestion by [National](#) Register of Citizens (NRC) [state](#) coordinator, Prateek Hajela to the Supreme Court to exclude five out of the 15 [documents](#) from NRC modalities. In a recent report submitted to the Supreme Court, Hajela had purportedly suggested that [ten documents](#) out of list "A" [documents](#) could be relied upon or introduced afresh by any claimant following his or her claim for inclusion of name in the NRC. The dharna to this effect was addressed by [President](#) Phul Mamud, and Secretaries, Mohibul Islam and Ainul Haque. Hundreds of activists rendered the air raising slogans against Hajela [state](#) and Union government. The members of the [student](#) body also submitted a memorandum to this effect to the Register of [India](#) through the office of the Deputy commissioner of [Udalguri](#)
