

AAP to contest in M'laya, Nagaland assembly polls



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NEW DELHI: The Aam Admi Party is gearing up to contest in the upcoming assembly polls in three north eastern states in March this year.

Talking to Assam Times, senior AAP [leaders](#) in [New Delhi](#) say the central [leaders](#) have been receiving good feedback from the [state leaders](#) and [workers](#) alike from the poll bound states of [Meghalaya](#), [Nagaland](#) and [Tripura](#).

"We are given to understand that our party has good prospect in [Meghalaya](#) where BJP is trying to wrest power from [Congress](#). We are in constant touch with the [state](#) leadership these days," said a senior AAP [leader](#) who refused to be named.

He said," we are contemplating to contest in all seats in [Meghalaya](#) and [Nagaland](#) apart from in at least [ten](#) to twenty seats in [Tripura](#)."

The central leadership are expected to hunker down in the capital city very [soon](#) to clear the poll strategies in the three north eastern states where assembly polls are due in March.

The ruling party in Delhi will take on both [Congress](#) and BJP to keep both the parties at bay even in Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Karnataka and Chattisgarh.

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
