

ABSU staged road blockade at Harisinga



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The dilapidated [state](#) of [Tangla](#)-Kathalguri-[Harisinga PWD](#) road in Udalguri district has been decried by people of the places. The road has been a vital link between [Tangla](#) and [Harisinga](#) since long back. But non completion of the road has made it near impossible to travel on it. Students, teachers and officials use this short road to visit [Harisinga](#) and [Udalguri](#). But people suffer much [as](#) and when there is a rainfall. During rainfall water filled pot holes play [as](#) death traps to people on bicycle, [bike](#) and four wheeler. Construction work of the road had started decade back, but due to reason not known the construction activities left undone. Protesting [against](#) the dilapidated [state](#) of the road and demanding its early completion, ABSU anchalik committees of [Tangla](#), [Harisinga](#) and Kasubil units staged road blockade programme today on June 24. Rinjoy Boro, president [Udalguri](#) district ABSU attending the programme said that local Minister Rihon Daimari had assured early completion of the road before Assam election last year. He requested Daimari to keep his words given to people.
