

Akhil procures bail in Titabor



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In yet another major breather for KMSS, a lower court in Titabor granted bail to Akhil Gogoi a day after police shifted the KMSS president from Guwahati Central Jail.

Judicial magistrate Abhijeet Kumar Baruah, who reserved the bail order on Sunday granted bail on a personal bond of Rs 10,000 on Monday after examining the medical reports of the KMSS president and the case diary filed by the Titabor police.

Gogoi was airdashed to Jorhat jail on Sunday after police got transit remand of the KMSS president in connection with the Case No 17/14 registered on February 3.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
