AMGURI: Hundreds of people took out a torch rally in Amguri on Sunday in protest against the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill, 2016 alleging it a conspiracy to push Assam, its people, language and culture to the verge of extinction.

Holding torches in their hands at the rally jointly organized by local KMSS and Ahom Jatiya Gana Manch, Assam, the protesters shouted slogans against the governments in Delhi and Dispur.

They, further, warned the government of dire consequences if it proceeds with the move for Indian citizenship for the non [Muslim](#) immigrants from [Bangladesh](#) and Pakistan.
