The [Adivasi National](#) Convention Committee (ANCC), a conglomeration organization of the ceasefire militant outfits of the [Adivasi community](#) has strongly expressed resentment [over](#) the snail pace of the peace talk and delayed solutions of the [community](#) issues which included granting of Scheduled Tribe ([ST](#)) status to the Adivasis.
