

Arunachal files review plea in SC



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The [Arunachal](#) Pradesh government has refused to [grant](#) refugee status to the Bangladeshi Chakmas and Hajong people who migrated in 1964-69 and urged the Supreme Court to review its judgment. In its recent review [petition](#) before the apex Supreme Court, the [state](#) government said that the court passed the judgment without hearing the state government.

It further told the court that out of total 4637 applications, 4213 applications for [citizenship](#) do not fulfill the criteria of signing of oath of allegiance, [as](#) per the second schedule to the Citizenship [Act](#), 1955 and police verification of character and antecedents required re-verification.

The apex court in September asked the government to accord refugee status to the [Chakma](#) Hajong people directing it to take all necessary steps to protect them [as](#) they are facing hostility from the local population.

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
