

Assam minority woes echo in UP electioneering

Many AIUDF top [leaders](#) from Assam have been camping in UP to join electioneering to help [Congress](#)-SP alliance win the ongoing assembly polls.

These top [leaders](#) include all thirteen party legislators apart from the three Lok Sabha members. Led by party president Badaruddin Ajmal, the party [leaders](#) and legislators have been campaigning in the [Muslim](#) dominated areas.

In a number of rallies in UP, party [leaders](#) keep telling the plights of the religious minority people in Assam after an end to the [Congress](#) regime. They told the [Muslim](#) people to ensure the victory of SP-[Congress](#) allies in the polls.
