

Assam-N'ld border on the boil



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The uneasy calm refuses to die down along the [Assam](#)-Nagaland [border](#) areas in [Golaghat](#) district a day after [Naga miscreants killed](#) two people apart from torching at least [50](#) houses in five places.

[Security forces](#) are on round the clock vigil apprehending [more](#) reign of terror by the [miscreants](#) in Umiamghat where thousands of people from five places have left their homes.

The massive exodus on Tuesday forced the district administration to set up at least six relief camps. A group of top civil and [police](#) officials has been constantly monitoring the entire situation.

Top officials told [Assam](#) Times that there is no report of any fresh [attack](#) of the [Naga miscreants](#) during the last 18 hours. But the local residents ruled that the security [forces](#) have failed to restore confidence in the area which is why, they have left their homes fearing backlash.

Notably, [Naga](#) militants on Tuesday shot [dead](#) two local residents of Umiamghat triggering utter tension and massive exodus.

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
