

Assam second in offence against state

Assam accounts for 11 per cent of cases of offences [against](#) the [state](#), the second highest in the country.

The [National Crime Record](#) Bureau data suggests that Assam stands next to Kerala with 72 cases of offences [against](#) the State in 2014.

According to NCRB data, these cases, mostly, pertained either to waging or attempting to wage [war](#) or abetting waging of [war against](#) the government (Section 121), conspiracy to commit offences punishable under Section 121 (Section 121 A), collecting arms with intention of waging [war against](#) the government (Section 122), concealing with intent to facilitate design to wage [war](#) (Section 123) or sedition.

Meghalaya has recorded 32 such cases. [Arunachal Pradesh](#), [Nagaland](#), Sikkim did not record a single offence [against](#) the State in 2014.

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ABSU burns copies of 'Hamkoshar Parishista' over Bodo script issue

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
