

Assamese Film "The Last Honour" Garneres Awards and International Acclaim



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Breaking barriers, the Assamese film "The Last Honour" has embarked on a global journey, captivating audiences worldwide.

This powerful feature film, based on the true story penned by renowned writer Jitumoni Bora, chronicles an extraordinary life during the COVID-19 pandemic.
