MARGHERITA: Tension refuses to die down in Margherita area in [Tinsukia](#) area on Thursday after a [group](#) of people allegedly forced a couple to strip off in full view of their children. The bizarre incident took place at No 1 Longtong near Lekhapani on Tuesday night when a [group](#) of people comprising Nabo Bora, Chandu Jaiswal and Dipak Mahato came to the house of Mohammed Jalil and forced him and his wife to strip off and asked them to convert to Hinduism if they want to stay in Assam.

The next day acting on their complaint the Lekhapani Police Station registered Case Number 119/17 IPC 448,153(A),354,504,506 and 34. The investigation is going on. Meanwhile, Abdul Rehman [President](#) of Jamiat Ulema E Hind [Tinsukia](#) district Committee have slammed and criticized the incident and demanded immediate arrest of the people. Minority [leader](#) of Margherita Toufik Khan said these people have not been caring not even an iota so long as BJP led Governments are existing in Delhi and Dispur.
