

Bandh disrupts normal life



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Normal life across the [state](#) comes to a grinding halt on Saturday following the 12 statewide Assam [bandh](#) in protest [against](#) the Centre's move for Indian [citizenship](#) for all non Muslim Bangladeshi and Pakistani nationals who have been staying in the country.

Vehicles are off from the streets. Shops and markets, schools and colleges, offices and banks refused to open under the impact of the paralyzing [bandh](#) which began at 5 in the morning to end at 5 in the evening.

The [bandh](#) is total in Guwahati [city](#) where ASTC is running a skeleton bus services. The [bandh](#), however, has hardly any impact in [Barak](#) valley.

At least 12 student organizations have called the [bandh](#) in protest [against](#) the move for Indian [citizenship](#) for all non Muslim Bangladeshi and Pakistani nationals who have been staying in the country.

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
