GUWAHATI: A senior BJP [leader](#) on Tuesday joined [Congress](#) alleging autocratic style of functionings by the [state](#) party leadership.

He is none other than Manoranjan [Das](#), the former party MLA from Pattacharkuchi who has finally joined [Congress](#) after several months of taking on the party leadership.

[Das](#) said it has become impossible for him to be with the party with a circle of selfish [leaders](#) at the helm.

He targetted [state](#) BJP president Ranjit [Das](#) alleging that he along with Himanta Biswa Sarma has been trying to dislodge Sarbanabda Sonowal as chief minister.

He joined the opposition party along with eight block [level](#) supporters at a function in the Rajib Bhawan in presence of several senior party [leaders](#).

Welcoming [Das](#) and his supporters to the party [state Congress](#) president Ripun Bora said it would be a huge boost for the opposition party ahead of the assembly polls.

[Das](#), who won with BJP in Pattacharkuchi in 2011 was not allowed to contest from the constituency in 2016 because of pre poll alliance with AGP and BPF.
