

BJP sees hardly hopes in Assam

Despite heavy concentration on Assam assembly polls central BJP [leaders](#) in [New Delhi](#) are believed to have eschewed the hope of a good performance in the upcoming assembly polls. Senior BJP [leaders](#) told Assam Times that the top poll managers are learnt to have agreed that the current political scenario does not suggest a huge poll [success](#) for BJP forcing the ruling party at the Centre to forge the poll alliance with BPF.

"Poll [deal](#) with BPF does not make any sense [as](#) the Boro regional party won't allow any BJP candidate to contest inside the BTAD. What they would do to help BJP outside BTAD?," said a senior BJP [leader](#) in [New Delhi](#).

Another top [leaders](#) said, "BJP would be able to take at least 15 MLAs on board from BPF if the party gets at least 40 seats. But BJP poll managers are unsure of 40 seats in view of the current scenario.

" The party is also aware of simmering resentment after [Narendra Modi](#)'s visit who failed to raise a fresh lease of hope for the BTAD people. "Equally the party poll strategists are worried [over](#) the lack of support in the grass root [level](#)," said the sources.
