

Blast in Kokrajhar Reserve Police

A grenade blasted and another recovered which were allegedly lobbed by the National Democratic Front of Boroland (Songbijit faction) at Police Reserved complex at Dimalgaon in [Kokrajhar](#) on [Wednesday](#) afternoon.

Sources said, two motorcycle borne [miscreants](#) lobbed the grenades, of which one was blast and another was recovered around 2.30 pm. [No](#) one casualty was reported and details is awaited.

A joint operation from security [forces](#) involving [police](#), army, [CRPF](#) conducted a search operation against NDFB inside the jungle of auzarbari under Serfanguri [police](#) station on [Wednesday](#).

Meanwhile, the NDFB(S) claimed that it was involved from the organisation. It has been observed that militant outfit organisation has show their strength after keeping of words of retaliation against security [forces](#) on Tuesday in [Kokrajhar](#) within 24-hours of their activities.

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ABSU burns copies of 'Hamkoshar Parishista' over Bodo script issue

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
