

Book on Hmar history released

Under the aegis of Hmar Literature Society (Hmar Sahitya Sabha) a book titled 'History of The Hmars in North East India' (with special reference to Assam) authored by Rev Hrilrokhum Thiek was released in a simple but solemn function held on Tuesday at the C H Khotlang Memorial at Moulhoi near Haflong.
