

Broad day light robbery in Golaghat

NK HANDIQUE FROM GOLAGHAT: In yet another incident that proves police failure in broad day light, goons in Golaghat town looted a huge amount of money from a person at gunpoint in front of the police station on Wednesday.

The bizarre incident took place at around 2 in the afternoon when Puna Bora, a resident of Gomariguri was on his way back to his home after withdrawing Rs 5.65 lakh by his Maruti Van.

As his vehicle reached Magic Stand of the town in front of the police station, three armed goons halted him.

Then they broke the glass of the van and looted the entire bundle of money to be vanished immediately.

Policemen arrived in the spot only after the goons had managed to flee. Police has registered a case and investigation is going on. This has proved utter failure of the police deployed to man the town and its people.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.



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
