

BTC review meeting on October 5



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A review meeting on BTC accord implementation will held in Delhi in October 5 to discuss the implementation of the clauses of the historic BTC accord. These include central assistance amounting of ₹1000 crores to the council, granting of [ST](#) (Hills) to the Bodo peoples in Karbi Anglong, functioning of departments in the council.
