

Captured rebels on transit remand

More sensational revelations seem to have surfaced on the [Adivasi carnage](#) in Assam as the Maharashtra Anti Terrorism Squad continues to grill the notorious NDFB-S militants after they caught in the state on Friday.

A team of Assam police is also arriving in Mumbai to take the trio on transit remand. They are believed to have been visiting Mumbai along with a few others to replenish their finances by tapping sympathizers. But they came to [city](#) to avoid the massive crackdown by security forces. Identified as B Songa alias Bisho, B Swamkhar and Purno [Narzary](#), the trio are natives Baksa district who were among the perpetrators to have killed over 80 people on December 25 last year.

Bisho's brother, also was also allegedly involved in the bloodbath was killed in an encounter with security forces in Assam in January this year. Acting on a tip-off from the Intelligence Bureau, an ATS team conducted surveillance of the suspects following which they were picked up on Friday night.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
