

Case against Himanta

Finally, Tezpur police have registered a case against Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma acting on the complaint of making communal statement in a recent poll rally.

The case bearing No 266/14 has been registered in Borhat police station on Tuesday. The case has been registered under Sec 171(F)/ IPC and Sec 125 under PRA.

Notably, Dr Sarma in a recent poll rally said that Muslim blood spills in the water pipes in Gujarat forcing BJP to move the election commission.

The election commission examined some other complaints against Gautom Roy, Akon Bora and Pradyut Bordoloi. But no case was registered against them.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
