

Cattle seized, smugglers arrested



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The Border Security Force (BSF) personnel on 25 August apprehended four cattle [smugglers](#) from the Indo-[Bangladesh](#) border area. Days back, the BSF troops under Guwahati frontier seized a large number of cattle heads meant for smuggling to [Bangladesh](#) from the same Dhubri international border locality.

“The cattle [smugglers](#) were identified [as](#) Rahim Ali (age 39 years), Jahikul Islam (57), Muktaadul Hassan (33) and Sahidul Islam (24). All of them hail from Mankachar in South Salmara district of Assam. The BSF troop [caught](#) them red-handed while they were trying to smuggle the cattle to [Bangladesh](#). They were already handed [over](#) to the local police,” said a statement issued by the Guwahati based BSF office.

Earlier the BSF personnel seized a large number of cattle from the same location on the night of 23 and 24 August. Altogether 312 cattle heads worth around rupees 24,25,800 were seized from the riverine border area.

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
