

CBI names Sadananda, 6 others

The Central Bureau of Investigation probing the Saradha scam has named Sadananda Gogoi along with at least ten others in the second chargesheet on Monday. The country's premier investigation agency has filed the chargesheet before the additional chief judicial magistrate in Alipore in the afternoon.

According to CBI, the chargesheet was filed in connection with a case registered against M/s Saradha Realty India Ltd. and others. The chargesheet named many companies of the chit fund aided group - Saradha Realty India Ltd., M/s. Saradha Tours & Travels Pvt. Ltd., M/s. Saradha Garden Resort & Hotel Pvt. Ltd. and M/s. Saradha Housing Pvt. Ltd. The cases were filed under section 120B (criminal conspiracy) read with 420 (cheating and dishonestly inducing delivery of property), 409 IPC (criminal breach of trust by public servant, or by banker, merchant or agent) and Section 4 and 6 of the Prize Chits and Money Circulation Schemes (Banning) Act 1978.

Other accused include Saradha boss chairman Sudipta Sen, his close aide Debjani Mukherjee, Trinamool [Congress leader](#) Rajat Majumdar, Aduo Sajjan Agarwal and Sandhir Agarwal.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
