

CBI probe into Farid case

The [Nagaland](#) government has recommended CBI probe into the mob lynching of Sayeed Farid Khan.

The government has written to the country's premier investigation agency seeking a thorough probe into the bizarre incident where rape accused who hails from Assam was lynched by a violent mob on the street after being dragged out of the [Dimapur](#) Central Jail on March 25.

Police have caught over 30 goons in this connection apart from disciplinary action [against](#) the jail authority.

Various parties and organizations have called it a conspiracy [against](#) the non Naga people in [Dimapur](#).

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
