

Chidambaram pushes onus of peace-talk to the state government

Union Home minister P Chidambaram today expressed his satisfaction over the law and order situation of Assam. He said in Guwahati that the improvement of complicated situation of the state is dramatic. After a meeting with Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi at Raj Bhawan he pushes onus of the forwarding peace-process with the rebel group to the state government.
