Yet another person died on Monday a week after he sustained burn injury in the orgy of [Churachandpur](#) violence.

The Joint Action Committee, a conglomeration of many civil society organizations announced relaxation of curfew in the vulnerable areas from morning 5 to 12 noon on Tuesday.

They have been enforcing the curfew to thwart any possible mob attack. It would be marked by another [bandh](#) call for 60 hours in the entire restive hills areas demanding resignation of the remaining trial MLAs by the next [ten](#) days and immediate withdrawal of the bills which have yet to be prorogued.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
