

Combing operation in Pengeri

Security forces are fanning at Pengeri area in [Tinsukia](#) district of Assam in search of four [ULFA](#) militants on Monday who are believed to have been hiding to extort money. Acting on a tip off [Tinsukia](#) police and army jawans conducted a raid in the area on Monday. But the miliants managed to flee after exchange of firing for a brief period of time in the evening.

Police later recovered an IED from the spot. Entire area is being cordoned off in search of the militants who recently came to the district at the instance of Paresh Baruah. Notably, Pangeri has become a safe haven for a section of [ULFA](#) militants to unleash reign of terror in the form of extortion and kidnapping in the area.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
