

Cong MLAs working for BJP!



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A stunning revelation seems to have created no less flutter in the crisis hit [Congress](#) legislature [party](#) one and a half years ahead of the [Assembly polls](#).

According to sources, apart from spreading [dissidence](#) within the [Congress](#) legislative [body](#), four ruling [party](#) legislators are allegedly working for BJP.

These four MLAs from upper [Assam](#)---the close associates of Dr [Himanta](#) Biswa [Sarma](#), have been working at the instance of a top BJP leader who wants mid term [poll](#) at an earlier [date](#).

The BJP topgun is believed to have assured them of [party](#) tickets if a mid term election warrants.

According to allegations, the four MLAs were campaigning against the [party](#) candidates at the instance of a powerful [dissident](#) minister.

Earlier, they were believed to have joined the [Sarma](#) camp to dislodge Tarun [Gogoi](#). But sources have confirmed that they have been trying to help Dr [Sarma](#) to dismiss the government which the outgoing [cabinet](#) minister does not want.

NAZIRA, September 27, 2026 — Tension continues to prevail in Nazira, particularly in the Santak-Bihubar area, following the killing of Biman Barua, president of the Rangajan Yuva Samaj and a youth social worker, on September 18 under Bihubar Police Station.

Following the killing, local residents have been demanding stringent punishment for the alleged masterminds, Ravindra Singh alias Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan, besides seeking demolition of Vicky Singh's residence.

Meanwhile, Sivasagar district police have taken Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan into custody and are questioning them at the district headquarters police station in connection with the murder case and allegations of drug-related activities.

According to police sources, the two allegedly told investigators during questioning that drugs were brought from Dimapur and Nagaland and stored at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister in Nazira town. The drugs were allegedly supplied from the house to users in different parts of Nazira and Sivasagar.

Based on the information allegedly obtained during the questioning, a joint team of Bihubar Police and Nazira Model Police Station conducted a raid at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister, Rinki Singh Bora, in Ward No. 6 of Nazira town on Saturday morning.

Police detained Rinki Singh Bora and are reportedly questioning her in connection with the alleged storage and distribution of drugs.

The investigation into the murder of Biman Barua and the alleged drug network is continuing.
