

Crack on city flyover



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[Over](#) 30 people had a narrow escape in Guwahati when the bus carrying them stopped just before overcoming a portion of a [flyover](#) which developed a huge crack on Tuesday.

It took place in the morning when the driver of the bus from Dibrugarh stopped as he came to spot the huge crack in the middle of the [flyover](#) at Eightmile area just a stone's throw distance from [Khanapara](#).

This has forced the authorities to restricted the movement of all vehicles from early in the morning.

Local residents and organizations blamed it all on the sub standard construction quality of the [flyover](#) on the East West corridor.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
