

Curfew back in Salbari

[Tension](#) is simmering in [Baksa](#) forcing the authorities to clamp [curfew](#) a day after four lemon traders were believed to have been [killed](#) by [NDFB-S](#) militants after being [kidnapped](#) in the district on Friday.

Talking to [Assam](#) Times, authorities said that indefinite [curfew](#) was clamped in [Salbari](#) sub-division under Gobardhana [police](#) station fearing an ethnic flare up.

[Security forces](#) are conducting a massive search to rescue the four traders. The army has also been called in and kept on stand by to deal with any untoward situation.

Four cycles and sandals were found from a nearby area. These were believed to have belonged to Bakar Ali, Saddam Ali, [Ataur](#) Rahman and [Rahul](#) Amin who were [kidnapped](#) at gunpoint at Labdanguri market in [Salbari](#) sub-division from adjacent [Barpeta](#) district.
