

Deal with jihadis: AASU to Govt



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The All Assam Students' Union (AASU) asked the government to firmly deal with the Islamic fundamentalists, including the Al-Qaeda, and the illegal Bangla migrants who have been sponsoring these dangerous elements.

In a statement, the state's influential student body demanded a high-level inquiry into the report telecast by a national television channel alleging involvement of Badruddin Ajmal, who is an MP from the State, in the [training](#) process of the jihadis in Bangladesh.
