

Demand for probe into Pul revelations



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The demand for a CBI probe into Kalikho Pul's revelations seems to have taken the centre stage of all political activities in [Arunachal](#) Pradesh.

A newly formed organization has moved governor [PB Acharya](#) demanding a thorough probe by CBI into the allegations by Kalikho in his Mere Veechar, a 60 paged booklet he was believed to have written just before his mysterious death.

The Mere Veechar Andolan Committee has alleged that the police officer who probe the hugely sensational case in [Itanagar](#) has vanished after he submitted the report.

The committee members have demanded resignation of [chief](#) minister Pema Khandu, his deputy and tourism parliamentary secretary whom Pul alleged to have embezzled money to the tune of crores of rupees.

The committee moved the governor a couple of days after one of Pul's wives filed an FIR for reinvestigation of the case in the light of the revelations

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
