

Don't speak ill of China: ULFA-I to Dalai Lama

[ULFA](#)'s Paresh Baruah faction has asked the Dalai Lama not to speak ill of China during his upcoming visit to Assam.

In a statement, [ULFA](#)(I) chairman Dr Abhijit [Asom](#) said that his anti-China remarks on the soil of Assam might trigger a 1962 like aggression on the [state](#). He made it plain that [ULFA](#)-I has nothing to oppose Dalai Lama's visit to the [state](#) if he tries to revive the Buddhist culture which existed in the ancient Assam. But he must not utter any word [against](#) China on behalf of [India](#) saying that China has no hostility with the [state](#).

On the other hand, the IIT-Guwahati has disallowed a function at its premises proposed to release the [Assamese](#) version of his book. The authority with the country's premier seat of science and technology has simply rejected the prayer to hold the ceremony without citing any reason.

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NAZIRA, September 27, 2026 — Tension continues to prevail in Nazira, particularly in the Santak-Bihubar area, following the killing of Biman Barua, president of the Rangajan Yuva Samaj and a youth social worker, on September 18 under Bihubar Police Station.

Following the killing, local residents have been demanding stringent punishment for the alleged masterminds, Ravindra Singh alias Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan, besides seeking demolition of Vicky Singh's residence.

Meanwhile, Sivasagar district police have taken Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan into custody and are questioning them at the district headquarters police station in connection with the murder case and allegations of drug-related activities.

According to police sources, the two allegedly told investigators during questioning that drugs were brought from Dimapur and Nagaland and stored at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister in Nazira town. The drugs were allegedly supplied from the house to users in different parts of Nazira and Sivasagar.

Based on the information allegedly obtained during the questioning, a joint team of Bihubar Police and Nazira Model Police Station conducted a raid at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister, Rinki Singh Bora, in Ward No. 6 of Nazira town on Saturday morning.

Police detained Rinki Singh Bora and are reportedly questioning her in connection with the alleged storage and distribution of drugs.

The investigation into the murder of Biman Barua and the alleged drug network is continuing.
