

Dreaded Garo rebel surrenders



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A hardcore [GNLA](#) rebel laid down his arms before BSF in [Meghalaya](#) on Friday giving the security forces a sigh of relief. According to BSF, identified [as](#) Marus Ch Sangma, who was trained up outside surrendered before the authorities in presence of Sankatha Prasad, the Commandant 20 Bn BSF at Tura in the evening.

The 26 year old local resident of Telekhali in Gasuapara, near Baghmara which falls under South [Garo Hills](#) district confessed to have joined [ANVC](#)-B in 2012 before undergoing three months arms [training](#) in [Bangladesh](#).

He confessed yo have received arms consignment, accessories and camouflaged dress from Bangladeshi national Dipon R Marak and Philip and delivered the consignments to [GNLA](#) cadres in forested areas of villages Telikhali and Jankhol in South Garo Hill district.

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
