

Durga puja ends in Kokrajhar



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Along with other parts of the country, Kokrajhar observed Bijaya Dashami of Durga Puja on Saturday by immersing the idols of the goddess of strength.

BTAD areas this time had 645 puja pendals beautiful decorated. Of these, Kokrajhar alone has 200 pandals in while Chirang haf 117 pendals apart from 120 in Baksa and 204 in [Udalguri](#) district.
