

Eviction: CM gets tougher



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Chief Minister Tarun [Gogoi](#) said that the eviction drive would not halt until and unless the [illegal settlers](#) are not evicted at all.

Talking to reporters on [Wednesday](#), [Gogoi](#) said that not even a single [illegal settlers](#) would be spared. He made it plain and simple that the entire drive against the rampant encroachment in the wetlands and hill tops would be carried out as per the [law](#).

District administration officials told [Assam](#) Times that altogether 46 pucca and huts were demolished apart from 21 temples and mosque and 35 boundary walls to clear 14 bighas of land.

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
