

Expert emphasizes better tie with Myanmar



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[Journalist](#) and democracy expert Bidhayak [Das](#), who is presently based in Yangon, the former capital of [Myanmar](#), emphasized on better tie with the neighboring country. Delivering a talk on the changing political scenario of [Myanmar](#) at Guwahati Press Club today, the media personality from Assam also expressed hope that the Union government in [New Delhi](#) would play a pro-active role in framing policies to [deal](#) with Indo-Burma issues.

[Das](#) observed that [Myanmar](#) has been adopting a kind of democracy which would be beneficial for the people of northeast [India](#) to get involved with bilateral [trade](#) with the southeast Asian country.
