

Flood scene deteriorates again

After a brief respite the flood situation again deteriorated following further rainfall in [Arunachal](#) Pradesh on Monday.

The water levels of the [Brahmaputra](#) and its tributaries started rising in the morning wreaking more havoc in Barpeta, Dhemaji, [Tinsukia](#), [Morigaon](#) and Lakhimpur districts.

The fury has already rendered [over](#) 3 lakh people homeless. The worst-hit district is Lakhimpur where [over](#) 9,200 people have been trapped to be followed by Barpeta with around [6](#),100 hit people.

According to government report, [over](#) 1,600 hectares of [crop](#) areas were under water currently. The death toll in the first wave of floods in Assam remained at three -- one each in Bongaigaon, Lakhimpur and Baksa districts.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
