

Flood scene improves further



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The [overall flood](#) situation starts improving on [Sunday](#) following the halt of [rains](#) in the catchment areas of Arunachal Pradesh.

The water level of the Brahmaputra and its tributaries are gradually receding during the last 24 hours.

“The waterlevels of the mighty river are expected to recede further during the last 24 hours,” water resources development department officials told [Assam](#) Times on [Sunday](#).

Surface communications that came into a grinding halt in Jorhat, [Sivasagar](#), Dibrugarh, [Lakhimpur](#) and [Dhemaji](#) have been restored after [flood](#) waters damaging crops in several hectors in [Lakhimpur](#) and [Dhemaji](#) districts.

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
