

Four killed in Boko truck mishap

Four persons died when a truck full of logs carrying them slipped into a ditch in Kamrup district bordering [Meghalaya](#) on Tuesday.

The shocking accident took place at Hahim in Boko where the logs fell on the four persons [as soon as](#) the truck met with the mishap. All of them died on the spot.

According to the local residents, the truck which was full of smuggled logs fell into the drain after the [driver](#) lost control [over](#) it.

Local residents and police rushed to the spot and took 5n hour to extricate the bodies. Police have registered a case to investigate it.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
