

Girl gangraped, battling with life at GMCH



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Yet another incident of gangrape sends no less shock and anger across the [state](#) on Thursday. The victim is battling to survive at the Gauhati Medical College Hospital.

The incident took place in Tamulpur areas where the

local residents [rescued](#) a girl from a house where she was gangraped on Wednesday night.

The villagers, further, caught one of the rapists to be thrashed before handing [over](#) to the police. The victim was initially rushed to a local hospital and then shifted to the GMCH.

A police team is interrogating the arrested rapist to extract the inputs of the whereabouts of other perpetrators. Many local organizations have demanded exemplary punishment for the perpetrators.

NAZIRA, September 27, 2026 — Tension continues to prevail in Nazira, particularly in the Santak-Bihubar area, following the killing of Biman Barua, president of the Rangajan Yuva Samaj and a youth social worker, on September 18 under Bihubar Police Station.

Following the killing, local residents have been demanding stringent punishment for the alleged masterminds, Ravindra Singh alias Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan, besides seeking demolition of Vicky Singh's residence.

Meanwhile, Sivasagar district police have taken Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan into custody and are questioning them at the district headquarters police station in connection with the murder case and allegations of drug-related activities.

According to police sources, the two allegedly told investigators during questioning that drugs were brought from Dimapur and Nagaland and stored at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister in Nazira town. The drugs were allegedly supplied from the house to users in different parts of Nazira and Sivasagar.

Based on the information allegedly obtained during the questioning, a joint team of Bihubar Police and Nazira Model Police Station conducted a raid at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister, Rinki Singh Bora, in Ward No. 6 of Nazira town on Saturday morning.

Police detained Rinki Singh Bora and are reportedly questioning her in connection with the alleged storage and distribution of drugs.

The investigation into the murder of Biman Barua and the alleged drug network is continuing.
