

Girl rescued from North East express at Kokrajhar

A minor girl was [rescued](#) from the [North East](#) express train at Kokrajhar railway station here today.

Getting information, members of Kokrajhar based [NGO](#) Nedan foundation and security forces belonging to Kokrajhar police and CRPF carried out a rescue operation and [rescued](#) the girl. The alleged trafficker was also nabbed. Sources said the girl was being taken by a youth identified [as](#) Deepak Singh of Uttar Pradesh. Singh was [caught](#) and handed [over](#) to the police. Angry mob who gathered at the railway station thrashed the alleged trafficker. He is admitted to Rupnath Brahma Civil hospital, Kokrajhar. The victim who is from a remote village in Chirang district said the accused promise her [marriage](#). She said she had known him since the last couple of month.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
