

Girls rescued; 2 traffickers held



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Despite a set of stringent measures women trafficking refuses to die down in the state. A circle of [girls](#) are still taken outside the state luring lucrative jobs by the traffickers in [New Delhi](#), UP, Haryana.

Police arrested a person along with a woman for trying to rush two [girls](#) to Kishanganj on Wednesday. Before that Railway police [rescued](#) two [girls](#) from Paltanbazar on the way to Bihar and Chhattisgarh on Wednesday. Acting on a tip off from a non governmental organization Gold, railway police [rescued](#) three [girls](#) from Sivasagar from Kamrup Express in the wee hours.

Hailing from Kanubari area in Sivasagar district, the two [girls](#) confessed to have agreed to leave for Haryana at the instance of two youths who promised them good jobs. Police investigation is going on.

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
