

Gloom in Namrup as Tai expert dead



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Namrup: A pall of [gloom](#) descends in Namrup following the sudden demise of Tai expert and historian Kamaleswar Gogoi on Thursday. He is 77 and passed away at a private hospital in Dibrugarh at 8.20 in the evening where he was admitted when he complained of breathing difficulty.

Born and brought up in Namrup Nagamati, Gogoi joined BVFCL in 1963 as an administration officer and stayed till retirement in 1994. He travelled abroad for conducting research on Tai language, literature and culture. As a result, he authored a few book on the subject.

As [soon](#) as the sad news spread like wild fire, people of all walks of life thronged his residence and paid him the last respect.
